I am a J.D.-Ph.D. student and an academic researcher at Yale Law School and I study consumer bankruptcy. I am requesting a fee waiver for my project "Children in Bankruptcy," which analyzes how dependent care affects bankruptcy. In particular, I want to evaluate the adequacy of the current level of exemptions allowed for dependent care, and I anticipate that the results will benefit parents with small children facing financial distress. Specifically, I want to collect the answers to Schedule J Part 1 Question 2 ("Do you have dependents?") for a random sample of 1,000 cases per district court, 94,000 cases in total. An exemption from the courts is necessary to make the project affordable. For each case, I will need the Schedule J attached to the petitions. The data will be used to calculate summary statistics and run regressions, which will quantify the effect of dependent care on bankruptcy outcome. The data will be stored securely with IRB approval.
