UNITED STATES BANKRUPTCY COURT

This matter is before the Court upon the application and request by Fabian Nagel (the "Applicant") for exemption from the fees imposed by the Electronic Public Access Fee Schedule adopted by the Judicial Conference of the United States Courts.

The Court finds, based upon the attached letter received on July 25, 2022, that the Applicant has demonstrated that an exemption is necessary in order to avoid unreasonable burdens and to promote public access to information.

Accordingly, the Applicant shall be exempt from the payment of fees for access via PACER to the electronic case files maintained in this Court to the extent such use is incurred in connection with the project described in the attached letter and application. The Applicant shall not be exempt from the payment of fees incurred in connection with other uses of the PACER system in this Court.

Additionally, the following limitations apply:

- 1. This fee exemption applies only to the Applicant, and is valid only for the purposes stated above.
- 2. This fee exemption applies only to the electronic case files of this Court that are available through the PACER system;
- 3. By accepting this exemption, the Applicant agrees not to sell for profit any data obtained as a result of receiving this exemption.
- 4. This exemption is valid from July 25, 2022 through December 31, 2023.

This exemption may be revoked at the discretion of the Court at any time. A copy of this Order shall be sent to the PACER Service Center.

I am a Ph.D. student at the University of Chicago studying consumer bankruptcies. In particular, I research the efficacy of consumer bankruptcy audits introduced in Paragraph 603 of the Bankruptcy Abuse Prevention and Consumer Protection Act (BAPCPA) of 2005. For this research, I need to access dockets and audit opinions submitted to bankruptcy courts. To ensure that my research preserves the privacy of individuals, a large sample size is desirable, which requires me to access many dockets and download several hundred audit opinions. Unfortunately, the information is not accessible outside of PACER. Hence, the research would impose high costs without the exemption. My research enhances our understanding of the consumer bankruptcy process and provides an evaluation of components of the BAPCPA 2005 reform and could potentially inform future policy making.

Application for Fee Exemption for Research Purposes

Dear Chief Judge Glenn, Dear Mr. Genna,

My name is Fabian Nagel. I am an Accounting Ph.D. student at the University of Chicago Booth School of Business. I am writing to apply for a Fee Exemption to access consumer bankruptcy filings in the New York Southern Bankruptcy Court until December 31, 2023.

In my dissertation, I research consumer bankruptcies and, in particular, the effect of accounting policies on consumer bankruptcy outcomes. The research project is intended for publication in an academic journal.

To understand the details of consumer bankruptcies, I would like to access several bankruptcy filings. Since access fees accumulate quickly, I would like to apply for a fee waiver from your court. To illustrate, understanding the details of approximately 100 consumer bankruptcies only would result in a PACER fee of several hundred USD.

All individual-level information will be anonymized to ensure the privacy of bankruptcy filers. The research project will benefit the public by examining the effects of important policy changes, which may affect the direction of future policy making and improve the bankruptcy system.

I believe that the number of accessed dockets will not affect other users of the system for electronic records. To ensure that regular users of the system are not affected at all, I will primarily access the system outside of regular business hours.

The <u>Senate Judiciary Committee</u> has recently advanced legislation to remove PACER fees altogether. However, the final passing of the bill and its implementation will likely take years. In the meantime, individual researchers still rely on individual courts to grant fee exemptions to access filings. I sincerely hope that the court can grant me a fee exemption for research purposes until December 31, 2023.
