The Court finds, based upon the attached letter received on April 14, 2022, that the Applicant has demonstrated that an exemption is necessary in order to avoid unreasonable burdens and to promote public access to information.

Accordingly, the Applicant shall be exempt from the payment of fees for access via PACER to the electronic case files maintained in this Court to the extent such use is incurred in connection with the project described in the attached letter and application. The Applicant shall not be exempt from the payment of fees incurred in connection with other uses of the PACER system in this Court.

Additionally, the following limitations apply:

- 1. This fee exemption applies only to the Applicant, and is valid only for the purposes stated above.
- 2. This fee exemption applies only to the electronic case files of this Court that are available through the PACER system;
- 3. By accepting this exemption, the Applicant agrees not to sell for profit any data obtained as a result of receiving this exemption.
- 4. This exemption is valid from May 1, 2022 through October 31, 2022.

This exemption may be revoked at the discretion of the Court at any time. A copy of this Order shall be sent to the PACER Service Center.

### Dear Sir or Madam,

My name is Christopher Naubert, and I am an economics PhD student at the CUNY Graduate Center. As part of my dissertation, I would like to use information from business bankruptcy filings to document the borrowing behavior of small and mid sized businesses. In the United States, there is no central credit registry for businesses. Recent research on small and mid sized business borrowing has relied on the Federal Reserve's Capital Assessments and Stress Testing information collection data set (labeled as the FR Y-14 data set). This data set contains information about loans for over \$1 million from banks with over \$100 billion in assets to business. Therefore, the data set excludes lending from small banks to small and mid sized business as well as non-bank lending to small and mid sized businesses. I would like to use the information contained in bankruptcy fillings, specifically forms B 206 A/B through B 207, to help fill this void. Forms B 206D and B 206E/F contain information on a firm's secured and unsecured creditors. The information form B 206D will help in documenting how much collateral small and mid sized businesses use, and if the amount of collateral used when borrowing from a large bank differs from the amount used when borrowing from a small bank. Additionally, form 206E/F will help in documenting the relative importance of nonbank financing for small and mid sized businesses as well the source of this financing. While the Federal Judicial Center Integrated Bankruptcy Database contains some of the necessary information, it does not include all necessary information. Specifically, the database does not include the basis for each unsecured claim. Without this information, one cannot isolate the importance of specific forms of unsecured credit and cannot determine if the unsecured credit is bank or non-bank financing. This information is contained in form 206E/F. A better understanding of small and mid sized business financing can help in designing better policy interventions following times of credit crises.

Due to the large number of bankruptcy filings, the cost of accessing all the documents necessary to complete this project would be prohibitively expensive. Therefore, I am asking for an exemption to access these forms. Thank you for taking the time to consider my request, and I look forward to hearing from you.
